Write a diary entry about your experiences of being a child in a workhouse.</p>	<p><b>Maths</b> Find out the top speed of a Victorian motor car.  Work out how long it would take you to drive from Land's End to London (or between two other locations) at this speed.</p>	<p><b>History</b> Find out about Doctor Barnardo and how he helped Victorian children to give them the freedom to live better lives. Create a fact file about him OR Write a letter to Doctor Barnardo explaining what you think of the actions he took.</p>
	<p><b>Science</b> During the Victorian era, engines were developed.  Draw a diagram that shows how steam could power a machine of your choosing.</p>	<p><b>Geography</b> What do you know about the British Empire?  Can you create a list of which countries were part of the British Empire? Find them on a world map.</p>	<p><b>English</b> Compare a modern-day inventor's life to that of a famous Victorian inventor.  How are their lives different? How did they create their inventions in different ways?</p>
	<p><b>Maths</b> Create a timeline for Queen Victoria's reign, including all the major events in her life.
